Greater Baton Rouge Pipeline Work

In 2020, we will begin replacing and installing new pipeline segments in Baton Rouge and the surrounding parishes. These investments reinforce and enhance the safety and reliability of our pipeline operations.

Pipeline Work Highlights



ExxonMobil Pipeline Company is focusing on maintenance and replacement work along approximately 120 miles of pipelines in four parishes.



These pipelines service ExxonMobil's Baton Rouge facilities and other operators in the region.



These projects represent more than \$500 million in capital investment in Ascension, East Baton Rouge, Iberville and West Baton Rouge Parishes.



Work will begin in October 2020 and will continue into 2022 in certain locations.

A 24/7/365 monitoring and control system that uses computers, alarms and other technologies designed to remotely activate protective measures



Installation at greater depths than required in many places to reduce the risk of third party damage



A cathodic protection system designed to guard against corrosion and help ensure ongoing integrity



Internal and external integrity assessments prior to and after placing the pipeline into service



Aerial and ground based inspectors regularly monitor the pipeline route for potential integrity issues
